Dear Friends,

Mommy's Light is celebrating serving our 100th child! Who are these young people? They live in urban and suburban settings across the Delaware Valley. They are boys and girls who are learning to read, practicing tying their shoes, navigating the ups and downs of adolescence, adjusting to braces, trying out for the soccer team and applying to colleges...and they are all children and teens who are grieving the deaths of their mothers.

Their moms have died from cancer, AIDS, lung disease, heart disease and in accidents. They each have unique, cherished memories of time spent with their mothers. Jakia used to go back-to-school shopping with her mother; Ryan and his mother loved visiting the zoo; and Jamison and Braden enjoyed baking holiday cookies and decorating their windows with paper snowflakes with their mother. Mommy's Light volunteers help these and other young people preserve their family traditions, once a year, each year until they turn 18.

While we celebrate serving our 100th child, Mommy's Light is committed to supporting the more than 20,000 maternally bereaved young people and their families living in the Delaware Valley through our bereavement education materials. Our on-line education materials are also available nationwide to more than 600,000 maternally bereaved young people and their families.

Many grieving children receive inaccurate spoken and unspoken messages from well-meaning adults about the right ways to grieve. Very often, these messages do not reflect a bereaved child's experiences and leave the child feeling alone and isolated. Mommy's Light's bereavement education materials are designed

to reduce the walls of silence surrounding many grieving children. Our materials provide information that not only helps people to understand children's bereavement, but also helps adults to create an environment that supports the complex realities of bereaved children's adaptation. When these children are ready to talk, adults need to be ready to listen.

This year, Mommy's Light successfully developed and participated in key fundraising events, which raised more than \$100,000. These monies and all donations will be used to support our (1) direct services, (2) the development, production and distribution of child bereavement education materials to thousands of surviving fathers and family members, health care providers, guidance counselors and funeral home directors and (3) operating expenses.

The pages of this annual newsletter highlight an outstanding year for Mommy's Light and those we serve. Thank you to Mommy's Light's dedicated and talented volunteers, staff and directors and to our generous donors, sponsors and patrons who made this year's success possible. With your support, we will continue to find ways to reach and serve maternally bereaved young people and their families.

Events At A Glance

Thank you to everyone who participated in these fundraising events, which also helped us educate the public about our services and recruit volunteers throughout the Delaware Valley.

MOMS Clubs: In November 2004, 17 area MOMS Clubs arranged for a fabulous night of after-hours shopping at the Exton Toys R Us and raised \$1,700 to support Mommy's Light.

Springfield Mall Night of Giving: The mall's November 2004 Night of Giving helped raise more than \$1,200 for Mommy's Light.

American Girl Fashion Shows: More than 1,500 people attended the five sold-out American Girl Fashion Shows hosted by The Saturday Club in March 2005. Mommy's Light received \$36,000 from the event, which included \$27,000 in corporate sponsorship monies raised by Mommy's Light.

1st Annual Mommy's Light 5K Run/1 Mile Fun Walk:

This April 2005 race was founded by Hillary DeLone, a mother of 3 who was diagnosed with breast cancer last year. Monique was watching television a few days after her mother, Rita, had unexpectedly died. Her attention was riveted by a local NBC News segment about Mommy's Light. After hearing about how other grieving children and teens were remembering their mothers by continuing family traditions, Monique called us and said she wanted to honor her mother in the same way. This 17 year-old was determined to do what was necessary to get Mommy's Light's services for herself and her two sisters. She completed the paperwork and convinced her father to submit the application. During the family interview, Monique shared with us that she wanted to cook her mother's special occasion dinner of chicken, cornbread and collard greens. Sher, her mother, and sisters would always make this delicious meal together to celebrate birthdays, good grades and other special events. Now, Monique and her sisters cook in honor and in celebration of their mother.

Jonathon

Jonathon, age 11, told Mommy's Light that he loved going out to breakfast with his mom, Rhoda. She would wake him up and persuade him to wash up and get dressed. Then they would walk down the street to a local diner. Jonathon always ordered French toast, and his mom always ordered grits. For Jonathon, the only hard part about going out to eat was waiting for the food to come. He asked Mommy's Light to arrange for him to go out to breakfast once a year as a way to remember his mom and what they loved to do together.

We delivered Jonathon's breakfast request package with many morning delights including the ingredients for a big breakfast at home, complete with grits, just to get him in the mood for his breakfast at the diner. Shampoo, soap and fluffy new towels to motivate Jonathon to 'wash up' before breakfast were received with a sheepish grin and giggles. When he opened the gift certificate to Sunny's Diner, he began jumping for joy! Before leaving, we had one last question for Jonathon. "What are you going to do while you wait for your food?" He responded, "Be patient?" He broke into a huge smile when we handed him a new game for his Game Boy to play while he waited patiently for his French toast.

For years, many professionals have espoused that the right way to mourn fully is to move on. Children's grief is assumed to be even shorter lived because of their ages. These beliefs persist despite the fact that bereavement researchers, counselors and the bereaved themselves consistently tell us that rituals to honor the connection with a deceased loved one are a helpful and natural part of mourning. It is important to know that children do not disengage, do not separate and do not end their connections with their deceased mothers, nor are they supposed to do so. The mother continues to be an important psychological resource in the child's growth process.

INDICATIONS THAT A GRIEVING CHILD MIGHT NEED HELP



For most families, grief is new and unfamiliar. Bereavement is a difficult and emotionally painful process. Still, most children have within themselves the ability to heal. Some, however, may require or want more help than they are receiving. How do we know if a grieving child needs additional support? If his or her grief is healthy or unhealthy?

Mommy's Light has developed a list of three red flag behaviors and 10 yellow flag behaviors to serve as a guideline for when a grieving child may require or benefit from additional support. A summary of this list is provided below. The full text is printed on our website at www.mommyslight.org.

RED FLAGS

Indicate a grieving child needs immediate help

There are few rules about what constitutes healthy and unhealthy grieving that can be applied to all children, but here are three. If a grieving child is doing any of the following, it is an emergency and the child needs immediate help:

- Hurting himself/herself
- Hurting someone else
- Damaging property

YELLOW FLAGS

Indicate a grieving child might benefit from additional support

When we use the term "yellow flags," it's just like a yellow light: *caution*. What is normal and healthy for one child may not be normal and healthy for another. Because grief is new and emotionally painful, what was normal before a loved one's death might not be normal now. If a child shows any of the following signs, it is worth considering whether this is normal for the child in these circumstances, or whether he or she needs help:

- The child indicates he or she wants additional help.
- The child never talks about the person who died.
- The child exhibits aggressive behaviors.
- The child says, "I want to die."
- The child experiences physical symptoms that do not have a physical cause.
- The child does not interact with friends and with other people as he or she did before the death.
- During the academic year following the death (not the one during which the death occurred) the child's academic performance is very different from what it used to be.
- The child feels guilty about the death.
- The child blames himself or herself for the death.
- After several months, the child feels anxious.

I printed out these life saving tips and keep a copy of them by my chair and refer to them often. I can honestly say that they have helped me to open the lines of communication with my nephew and we can now talk about my sister (his mom) with an ease and understanding that is helping us both tremendously.
